

























HIGHLIGHTS

Unemployment in the region was consistently lower than the rest of California, with an 11% unemployment rate in 2010 (See Figure 5).

Non-Latino Whites are the overwhelming majority in the region, representing 67% of the population (See Figure 1).

In 2010, the region lost nearly 13,500 jobs, which is the largest decline in jobs between 1996 and 2010 (See Figure 6).
